- a brief presentation regarding EPA's review of the recent cross-section pilot study that identified high levels of hazardous to human health heavy metals in newborns first fecal excretions in samples collected in Butte.

We (the GNCDInc.) are not saying that there is an EPA, DEQ, B-SB qualifying Health Emergency due to the Human Exposure to the Hazardous to Human Health Heavy Metals Contaminants Present in Butte-Silver Bow.

We are concerned however; - That we now have five (5) independent studies that indicate that we do have low levels of hazardous to human health contaminants present in the; water, soil, buildings, and air; (multiple samples of the air collected and tested at 3 different sites, and 1 sample at each of 2 locations) most probably; from the Natural Ore Lode, from 140 years of Historic Mine Waste Deposits, and from Active Open Pit Mining.

We are concerned; - That people are dying at a rate from diseases associated with heavy metals exposure faster in the Greater Butte Silver Bow Community (not just the BPSOU Superfund site) than they are in all other counties in Montana, and are ingesting and accumulating these Hazardous to Human Health Heavy Metals Contaminants in their bodies in larger quantities than in other locations.

The recent independent health studies relative to the Hazardous to Human Health Heavy Metals Contaminants Present in Butte-Silver Bow do not show enough people dying fast enough, nor that the concentrations of the "Contaminants of Concern" or other heavy metals contaminants and their interaction that have negative effects on the human body are great enough to qualify for a Health Emergency.

But the independent studies indicate that we should still be concerned, and working together to do whatever is possible to minimize human exposure to the hazardous to human health heavy metals contaminants present in our community.

Therefore we are submitted this GNCDInc, List of Concerns to the B-SB Health Studies Committee for their consideration and action.

We are asking; may we all work together to make the Greater Butte Silver Bow Community a safer and healthier place in which to live and work.

A good place for EPA, DEQ and the B-SB Health Study Committee to start might be to ask themselves the question; When it is generally understood that both water and air flow why do we have about 250 Test Wells for contaminants in groundwater, and only one (1) Test Station for contaminants in the air?

The Health Department may have to change their procedures and methods to detect the contaminants in the dust.

As for the Alarmist Greeley Group I represent we are tired of eating, breathing and ingesting the airborne harmful to human health heavy metals laden dust.
