3-501.16(A)	Pre-made packaged hamburgers in display fridge are at temperatures of 45F. The rate of bacteria growth and possible toxin production can be greatly reduced when foods are held at temperatures below 41F. Person in charge moved burgers to walk-in cooler and called maintenance. Person in charge agreed to monitor fridge to make sure food is holding below 41F.
