4-501.114	The pump system for the sanitizer in the triple sink was not working properly at time of inspection. There was not any sanitizer being pumped into the 3-compartment sink. The test strip indicated that the wiping cloth bucket behind the counter sink also did not have any sanitizer concentration. Be sure to test these concentrations at least once a day to ensure proper sanitization concentrations.	1-25-2016
note	Be sure there is a separation between chemicals and food and beverage products. In the walk-in cooler, be sure to do some more organizing to ensure that products stay off the floor.
